

ACADEMIC DISTINCTION

Earn 4 merits beyond araduation requirements with a weighted cumulative GPA of 3.5 in grades 11 & 12 within a discipline. Students can pursue multiple distinctions.

ACADEMIC HONORS

Highest level of academic achievement. Completion of: 1) Three distinctions, 2) Interdisciplinary Senior Capstone, 3) Honors Knowledge & Truth course (beginning with the Class of 2025), and 4) Composite cumulative weighted GPA of 3.75.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must take an average of 6 courses per semester to be on track for graduation. The Class of 2024 needs 24.50

COVID Response: The school delivered 100% online learning in March - May 2020. Most students returned for in-person learning for the majority of the 2020-2021 academic year, while a small percentage of the student population (mostly international students) continued with both synchronous and asynchronous online learning throughout the entire 2020-2021 academic year. All students returned to in-person learning in fall 2021.
